Following a general anaesthetic, it is important to have someone stay with you overnight. Your judgement and responses may be affected and you may feel light-headed and nauseous (sick).

It is important to avoid any of the following for at least 24 hours, and preferably 48 hours:

- Driving
- Use of any power tool or mechanical machinery
- Drinking alcohol
- Taking Aspirin
- Undue exertion
- Making any vital decisions or signing any important documents
- Avoid smoking and vaping and smoky atmospheres until your wound has healed

What to expect after your surgery

During the first 24 hours, there may be some discomfort. Taking the pain relief prescribed for you will help to relieve this.

Some tenderness and pain is expected after the surgery. If you notice swelling and redness, or you have excessive pain please contact us at the clinic so that we can advise you.

If you have had surgery on your face, neck or head please do not bend down for 48 hours. This will cause pressure on your wound and increase the risk of bleeding.

If bleeding does occur, apply continuous firm pressure with clean gauze, which we have supplied for you, for 10 minutes. You may need to do this more than once.

Keep dressings clean and dry unless advised that you may bathe with the dressing in place.

Please contact us for advice if you have any of the following concerns:

- Swelling
- Tight dressing
- Excessive bleeding
- Pain not relieved by medication
- Numbness or tingling in your arms or hands
- Pain Swelling or Redness in your leg
- Fever
