The massage stimulates the drainage of lymph and boosts the removal of waste products from the area. The lymphatics are the body's waste disposal system, collecting any toxins that we need to get rid of. As a result, MLD offers many benefits including speeding up healing following cosmetic surgery, reducing pain, swelling and bruising and maintaining your body's normal healthy function.

At Bella Vou, Manual Lymphatic Drainage is frequently used together with Deep Oscillation® Therapy to improve post-operative recovery. Manual Lymphatic Drainage can reduce swelling and bruising; therefore easing pain and accelerating healing after surgery.

The cosmetic surgeons at Bella Vou recommend MLD during recovery from a number of procedures, including Vaser Liposculpture, Tummy Tuck, Liposuction and Breast Surgery.

MLD can also improve healing following fractures and soft tissue injuries. The therapy can ease symptoms for people living with chronic conditions such as rheumatoid arthritis, migraines, sinusitis, irritable bowel syndrome (IBS) and acne. It offers benefits for people in which the lymphatic fluid builds up, including fibromyalgia, cellulite and lymphoedema.

What happens in Manual Lymphatic Drainage?

The specialist therapist uses their hands to gently move the skin and stimulate lymphatic flow. Techniques can include rhythmic cupping, stroking and soft circular massage. All the methods are gentle, so treatment is relaxing, pleasant and pain free.

How long is recovery from Manual Lymphatic Drainage?

MLD is gentle and you should be able to get on with normal activities immediately following treatment. However, for anyone recovering from surgery, it's important to follow your surgeon's post-operative advice.

The massage has rapid effects. Many patients notice reduced swelling and pain following treatment, limbs can feel lighter and more mobile. A programme of repeat treatments may be necessary to assist recovery.

No specific preparation is needed for your therapy. If you have any concerns the staff at Bella Vou will always be on hand to answer your questions and offer support.

What happens during Manual Lymphatic Drainage

Manual Lymphatic Drainage is carried out as an outpatient procedure. It is not painful, so no anaesthetic is necessary.

The therapist uses their hands to gently warm, massage and stroke the skin in the direction of lymphatic flow. The treatment is very gentle. The lymphatic drainage points are immediately below the skin. So, light touch is enough to encourage the fluid to move into the lymph vessels. As a result, the treatment should be soothing and deeply relaxing.

Recovery from Manual Lymphatic Drainage

After the procedure most people are able to go home and get on with normal activities. However, the staff at Bella Vou are always on hand to offer you a drink or a snack and answer any questions.

Should anyone avoid MLD?

MLD is generally a safe and gentle treatment. However, some people should avoid therapy and see their doctor. This includes people with heart failure, sepsis and acute renal failure.

Lymphoedema frequently develops following cancer treatment. For many people MLD can offer some relief from swelling and discomfort. However, people with malignant lymphedema as a result of active cancer should see their oncologist or cancer specialist before seeking therapy.

Does MLD replace other forms of therapy?

MLD does not replace other therapies, however it is the treatment of choice in conditions such as lymphoedema. Many treatments including **Deep Oscillation® Therapy** also offer significant benefits. At Bella Vou the therapies are often used together. The effects are intensified, so that the patient achieves the best outcome.
